






# THE ANCIENT AND ACCEPTED SCOTTISH RITE

- Origin: May 1801, Charleston, South Carolina most degrees an amalgamation
- Founders: The Eleven Gentlemen of Charleston; Degree work rituals largely composed by Albert Pike from 1857 to 1883. Various revisions thereafter
- Degrees: 1 3 (Unworked) 4 to 33
- Jurisdictions: Southern Jurisdiction, Northern Jurisdiction, Louisiana, France, Canada, England, and Wales
- Principals: ethics and philosophy










### ALLIED MASONIC DEGREES OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

#### THE ALLIED MASONIC DEGREES





- Origin: August 1870 (AAONMS) / 1893 (AEAONMS)
- Founders: Walter M. Fleming, and William J. Florence
- Members: Master Mason (AAONMS) / 32<sup>nd</sup> or Knights Templar (AEAONMS)
- Principals: fun, fellowship, philanthropy
- Ritual: Based claimed to be based upon an elaborate Arab staged musical comedy that Florence twice witnessed and was initiated into.

## WOMEN AND CHILDREN MASONIC ORDERS



- Order of Eastern Star (1870 Rob Morris) Most prevalent option for female relatives of Freemasons, but many Masonic Rites for men have an adopted female counterpart. There might not always be a requirement to be an Eastern Star first.
- An estimated 10,000 women Freemasons around the world in over 350 craft lodges. Not including co-Lodges of men and women. Considered to be irregular.
- Various Masonic orders for children of Freemasons and other youth groups, such as DeMolay, Rainbow Girls, Girls Assembly, Jobs Daughters, Knights of Pythagoras

# CATHOLIC CATECHISM ON FREEMASONRY

#### Anglo vs. Continental Freemasonry

- Continental Freemasonry, also known as Liberal Freemasonry, Latin Freemasonry and Adogmatic Freemasonry, includes the Masonic lodges, primarily on the continent of Europe, that recognize the Grand Orient de France
- Schism has existed since post-American Civil War, with the GOdF passed a resolution stating that "neither color, race, nor religion should disqualify a man for initiation" and recognized a Grand Lodge in Louisiana that was considered irregular by the mainstream Grand Lodge of Louisiana. This led to many Grand Lodges in USA withdrawing their recognitions of GOdF.
- Further widening of schism occurred in 1877 when the GOdF changed constitution to allow for those who did not believe in God to be initiated.
- It is this Continental sect of freemasonry that has the most negative and harmful intersects with the Catholic Church in France, Italy, Mexico, the Caribbean, and South America.
- Different ending to the Legend of Hiram Abiff







# CATHOLIC CATECHISM ON FREEMASONRY

#### Prince Hall Freemasonry

- African Lodge #459 Chartered by Grand Lodge of England in 1784
- Prince Hall, first Worshipful Master of African Lodge #459. Perhaps from England, Boston Educator and Abolitionists.. Thought he could blend Christianity with Freemasonry to elevate the condition of Blacks in America.
- Normalized racism against Blacks caused mainstream American Freemasons to discriminate against Black Freemasons and consider them irregular until the 1980's when a trend towards fraternal relations began..
- Flirtations with Continental Freemasonry, but Anglo founded, and Anglo recognized today, and uses the Anglo Legend of Hiram Abiff.
- The Black bourgeoise class, social status, role in underground railroad, spreading Black Protestant Christianity.,
- Intersects with Catholic Church prohibition against Freemasonry in struggle to bring post–Civil War Blacks into the Church.
